WHAT IS CKSP?

The U.S. Air and Space Force Commander's Key Support Program (CKSP) is an official Unit Family Readiness Program designed to enhance readiness and establish a sense of community.



WHAT IS A KSL?

A Key Support Liaison (KSL) is a volunteer in the U.S. Air Force's Commander's Key Support Program (CKSP). KSLs connect Air Force families with resources and information.

WHAT DOES A KSL DO?

COMMUNICATE

- KSLs promote communication between unit leadership, families, and the Military & Family Readiness Center (M&FRC)

ADVOCATE

- KSLs advocate for unit needs and concerns, and help identify strengths and challenges

CONNECT

- KSLs connect families with resources for childcare, education, healthcare, housing, and employment

BUILD COMMUNITY

- KSLs help build a sense of community and resilience within the unit



WHO CAN BECOME A KSL?

- The unit Commander appoints KSLs
- KSLs are volunteers who are empathetic, caring, and organized
- KSLs are accountable to the Commander or their designee
